ages twelve through fifteen, as of June 15, 2007.

The following programs and activities are typical of those offered at
the Michigan Wilderness Student Adventure:

- Archery safety*
- Varied fishing types and activities
- Orienteering (maps, GPS, etc.)
- Outdoor Activities
- Canoeing
- Swimming
- Outdoor survival skills

*All students will be given the opportunity to earn their Hunter Safety
and Archery Safety certificates.

Students must meet one or more of the following criteria in order to be eligible for a scholarship:

- Limited to no experience in hunting and the outdoors.
- Lack of family financial resources to attend a program of this nature.
- Lack of an active mentor to expose them to outdoor activities.
- Not yet having earned a Michigan Hunter Safety Certificate.
