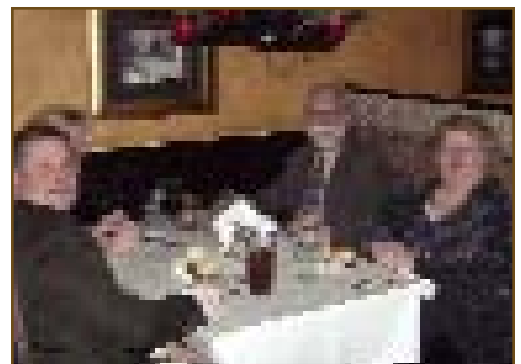

# A Message from Our President

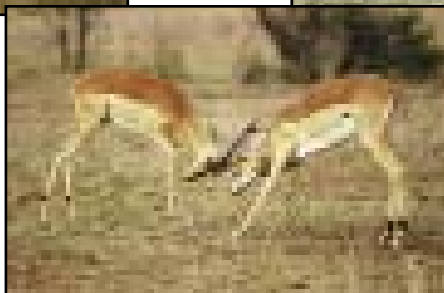

# AFRICAN GAME HUNTERS

**A**frican Game Hunters is a new donor to our chapter, and has generously donated a 2 hunter South African Safari for the upcoming 19th Annual fundraiser. On Jan. 17th, I attended a “Meet and Greet” event with African Game Hunters, held at the Hunts With Double Indoor shooting facility in Shelby Township. The event was hosted by David Grieco, the US representative for African Game Hunters. The host, AGH’s owner, and a PH that were present all impressed me as knowledgeable, young and enthusiastic hunters.

African Game Hunters operates from a nearly 5,000 acre base camp in the Limpopo province of South Africa, with access to over 80,000 additional acres in hunting concessions throughout the country. They offer hunting for a multitude of plains game species, as well as hunting for members of the “Big 5”, including Buffalo, Leopard, Lion and

Elephant. Their trophy photos and video depicted some very nice animals, including a truly spectacular Nyala that caught my eye! AGH offers package hunts catering to both new and experienced Africa hands, as well as daily rate and trophy fee hunts for those wanting an a la carte experience. The hunt they have donated for our fundraiser is for 2 hunters, and includes all daily rates for 5 days, plus trophy fees for 1 Gemsbok, 1 Blue Wildebeest, 2 Warthogs and 2 Impala. Also included are all accommodations and meals, as well as transportation from Johannesburg. The included animals are to be shared between the two hunters. Method of hunting is rifle, or bow with approval of the outfitter. It looks like someone will be getting a great hunt with a great new outfitter, so come on out and bid!

I just returned from the annual SCI Convention in Reno, Nevada, which I attended with past Chapter President, Terry Broemer. We also met up with Chapter member David Sturtz while there, and spent some time touring the show with him. As most of you know, the convention is enormous – 1,300 exhibitors, hundreds of thousands of square feet of displays, and nearly 25,000 members in attendance. Meetings, seminars, and lectures by dozens of presenters go on throughout the 4 day event. It can be overwhelming. I’m like a kid let loose in a candy store, running from one exhibitor to the next. I can honestly say there are very few booths there that don’t interest me in some way, be it hunts I’d like to take, new guns or equipment that interest me, or just the fascinating high-end firearms, artwork, jewelry, etc. As David Sturtz described it, it can be “sensory overload”.

We did, however, go out to do some business for the chapter, and we did well. As with many other chapters, we normally go to Reno looking to firm up details of items donated for our

fundraiser, to “hustle up” some new donations, and just to renew acquaintances and say thank you to our established donors. We have several new donors this year that were lined up in Reno, so look for them at our fundraiser in February. One enthusiastic new donor was Kimihia Safaris from New Zealand, who donated a 5 day hunt with credit towards trophy fees, so thank you goes out to them.

As many of you who read this newsletter know, John is a long-time member of the Novi Chapter and an avid hunter, as well as a regular contributor of hunting articles in this publication. 6. May enter only deer personally shot.

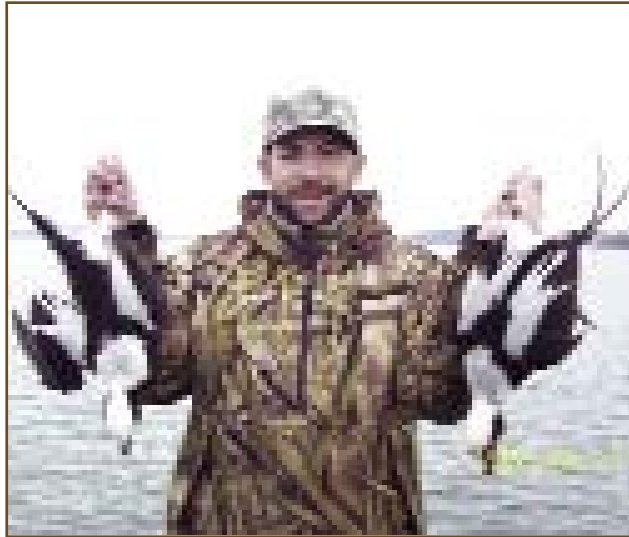

# Massachusetts Duck Hunt

While attending the SCI Lakeshore Sportsmen Chapter banquet last winter, I was intrigued by one of the auction items, a Massachusetts Duck Hunt for Sea Ducks. When I inquired to John Hughes, a past President of their chapter about the hunt, he gave it an enthusiastic endorsement and not to my surprise had been on the hunt. The night went on, there was beer involved and I ended up with a Sea Duck Hunt for six.

Over the course of the summer the group formed for the trip. Our group consisted of Novi Chapter past President Brent Gibson, chapter member John Thompson, Jeff Bryson, Dave Fisher of Muskegon and me. I contacted Captain Reilly McCue several times over the summer. Dates were discussed and by late fall we had decided on three days in December, the 14th thru 16th. John Thompson influenced the date selection as there was a Boston Bruins game on the 14th. The biggest logistical challenge was getting five guys and all of their gear in a vehicle with some level of comfort. It can't be done. We settled on renting a Chevy Suburban for a week, but as luck would have it, it was not at the unnamed rental car company when we arrived to pick it up. After much scrambling around, National Rental Car came through with a Ford Excursion that was actually \$100 cheaper on a weekly rate. We loaded up on Sunday morning with trip tick and GPS targeted for Massachusetts. WE encountered bad weather in Pennsylvania and were literally stopped on the freeway for several hours. We got to our home away from home, Stripers Inn in Newburyport, MA about midnight. Not good when you have to meet the guide at 4:00 AM.



It was great to finally meet Reilly after so many conversations with him. You know how you picture someone in your mind and then you meet them and they look entirely different. This was the case. Reilly is like a cross between the Duck Commander and Bob Marley. We loaded up with coffee,

headed to the boat dock and as Thompson would say it was "game on." Reilly has a great boat, a 21 foot Duck Water Boat. It was very well organized with every kind of decoy that you may need for a man in the business of being an eastern shore duck guide. The trip wasn't long to our hunting grounds but it was very exciting for a bunch of Midwestern Land Lubbers. Our quarry was to be Common Eider and anything else that may come in. Reilly skillfully set the decoys in the dark. We were getting dive bombed by Eiders as he finished the set. Once they were set and the anchor placed all hell broke loose. There was great action all morning with several fully plumed drake and hen eiders hitting the water. Inevitably Reilly would have to shout "shoot 'em again" several times to finally kill them. They were very hardy birds indeed. Most were shooting 3-1/2" BB out of Beretta Xtremas

and Benellis. Fisher was shooting a 10 Gauge Browning. With the exception of Jeff getting sea sick, it was a great morning shoot. I was luck enough to kill a nice mature drake red breasted merganser in addition to the eiders.

The afternoon consisted of cleaning the birds that we did not want to mount, finding a sea food spot that served local beer for lunch and not sleeping. By late afternoon we were off to the hockey game and the "new" Boston Garden. A great time

was had by all. There were several courses of the “Good Ole Hockey Game” on the way home. Bruins lost in overtime the Flyers. It was home at midnight and you guessed it, up at 4:00 AM to meet Reilly.

The second day we were after Black Scoter as our main target. We had about a 45 minute run out into the Atlantic and hunted off of the Parker River National Wildlife Refuge. It was a great shoot. We shot Black Scoter, White Winged Scoter and several Long Tail or Old Squaw. Reilly gave us a great deal of information about each species such as where they hatched their young and where they would ultimately winter. The respect that he had for our game was obvious. The ocean was very calm this day, the calmest that Reilly can recall in the month of December. He took us the long way back to port through some of the tidal marshes. After photos and duck cleaning it was back to Stripers Inn for lunch and getting ready for a lobster dinner.

Our last day of shooting did not come off as planned. We put in at a different location with the intent of shooting more eiders. The ocean was not cooperative and the winds were very strong out of the northeast preventing us from getting out to the bid water. Reilly’s back up plan was to set up in the tidal marshes with the hunters on land, a few decoys out and shooting puddle ducks. We had great shooting in the late morning, taking mallards and buffleheads. It was a great ending to a wonderful trip. We would all recommend this trip highly. In addition to sea duck hunting, Reilly also guides for puddle ducks on Lake Champlain, Turkey in Massachusetts, moose in New Hampshire and Vermont and striped bass and ocean fish during the summer.
